Enjoy beautiful club house environment on a beautifully paved, 3.4 mile long course! Spring Mountain Motorsports Ranch has dedicated a ton of money and resources to keep this facility in tip top shape, and have continued to upgrade and improve the amenities provided on-site. This is truly a country club experience for us track junkies!

Because of the members only nature of Spring Mountain, we've never had the opportunity to operate our excellent DE programs here. Most of us have probably never turned a lap on this track, so it will be an exciting opportunity for even the most experienced drivers to LEARN something new.

This is a two-day weekend event at the end of the year. It'll be great to bring the family to Vegas, stay the week for Christmas or New Years, and cap off the year at the track.

As far as I know, this is the FIRST TIME the Pacific Region is holding an event at Spring Mountain in well over 10 years. The owners of Spring Mountain has poured a ton of money into making this a true oasis for track junkies in the middle of the desert, a beautiful country club like setting with a world-class track expandable up to 7.1 miles! We'll be using the 3.1 mile course below:

Early registration is \$399 for A+ group, \$419 for CCA members, and \$469 for non-CCA members. Keep in mind that Spring Mountain is a MEMBERSHIP ONLY country club, and the fee for membership is about \$30,000 per year. The L.A. Chapter haven't had a DE this affordable in a long time, due to escalating cost of track rental and cost of operations, and will not likely have a track event this reasonably priced for the foreseeable future!

Dropping to second, as you turn in and target the orange plastic barrel marking the first apex, a shriek of delight is heard from the back seat. Runway? Passengers? What is going on here? Welcome to the Coronado Speed Festival..."

Driving with the Master Himself: Scott Pruett

I first heard of Scott Pruett and was fortunate enough to not only meet him but sit at the same dinner table at Legends of the Autobahn in 2009. Little did I know that four years later I would be sharing a race track and actually working alongside him!

The Historic Motor Sports Association allowed us hot lap drivers a 20 minute session to give rides to our club members and event VIPs during a track break. At about the same time, Scott Pruett came over from the Arrive-and-Drive area in an M5. The group of M cars were already at turn 2, and he took off down the front straight, familiarizing himself with the track layout. After a few laps, he pitted with the other drivers as they took a new car load of passengers.

Scott approched me and asked how we could spice up the driving format. I had a professional racecar driver in front of me and he wanted to give his passengers a real ride! I advised him that we can do two things: put you in the front and lead everyone around the track, or stay behind the lead car and do some 'dancing' with the leader. We agreed on option B and I informed the rest of the team what Scott was going to do.

I was handed the radio and told to take the lead car, an E93 M3. Scott Pruett is going to be behind me while I lead him and the other drivers around the track! With passengers loaded into the cars and Scott tucked behind me, I took off down the front straight in the M3, hitting redline in gears 1,2, 3 and into 4th. Through the turns I could see Scott keeping the M5 off my bumper and out of the dirty air behind me. Every time I braked, Scott would come to my inside or outside to give his passengers a "show". It was perfect! It was as if we were racing—Scott trying to pass, and me protecting the outside or inside line. After 2 laps, we pitted for our next group of passengers. I hopped out of the car and asked Scott if that technique worked to his satisfaction. He said, "Yes! It worked perfectly and I'll keep doing it to give my passengers a ride." I informed the next lead driver, Peter Engels, of what Scott was going to do. With an extremely large grin he said, "Really?" "Ok!" and off they went.

Working with Scott was certainly a treat. I along with the rest of our driver team was honored to share the track with him and we look forward to doing it again in the future.

Local BMW Dealership Principals and General Managers Fared Well in the 16th Annual Coronado Speed Festival

Racing in Group 9 were Tim and Tom Brecht, owners of BMW of Escondido, Jeff Gerken, General Manager of BMW of El Cajon and Craig Hauenstein, General Manager of BMW of San Diego. Not surprisingly, all were driving BMW 1600's and 2002's which dated from 1968-69. All these cars usually race in the B Sedan class for production sedans under two liters. Some of the other brands in the race were Alfa Romero GTV's, Datsun 510's, and a 710, a Porsche 911, and a Lotus Cortina.

All totaled there were 12 Alfa's, 8 BMW's, 8 Datsun's, and one of each of the last two mentioned above.

Tim was first on the starting grid, Craig 8th, Jeff 14th and Tom 30th of the 30 qualifiers. After 25 minutes of tight racing, when the checkered flag was shown, Tim placed

first, Craig moved from 8th to 3rd, Jeff from 14th to 4th and Tom from 30th all the way to 11th. Tim had the best lap time of the entire group

at 1:15.569. The average speed over the 1.44 mile 12 turn course was between 65-68 miles per hour for the first four finishers.



All said, the BMW's ruled three of the top four places with only the Alfa GTV of John Norman breaking up the threesome. Yours truly was gridded 16th and finished 17 in my '69 2002.

These events are what you make them; you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

The entry fee is \$65, including breakfast items, lunch and beverages. You can pay online if you register in advance at http://sdbmwcca.motorsportreg.com, or with cash or check if you wait to register onsite. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate, and you can join online at www.bmwcca.org in advance. Please print and bring your membership confirmation if you have not yet received your BMW CCA membership card. We check membership of all participants at the gate.

When you arrive:

- 1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.
- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and

unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

Stock classes permit any size wheel and tire; non-stock shock absorbers, bushings and strut braces; any brake pad material (brakes must be stock-size), any air filter or cold air intake or cat-back exhaust; and naturally-aspirated cars may use aftermarket engine management software. Tires must be 140 treadwear rated or higher in Stock. ANY other performance modification, including but not limited to springs, "R"-compound tires, and engine software for turbocharged/supercharged cars, puts the car in Modified. Non-DOT tires (i.e. slicks) on any car place it in Gold Class. All cars must be under a 92 dB noise level to be driven at Qualcomm—and we'll be checking. Our car classes are kept simple so we can use the honor system.

Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We also award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. For example, a very fast novice could win a novice trophy and a trophy in his car class. Remember, you are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a trophy you are now a ringer, not a novice.

the end of the year will be eligible for matching funds. The potential impact: \$500,000!


