The President's Column

As I write this, final preparation is being completed for our annual Chuckwalla High Performance Driving Education (HPDE) and BMW CCA Club Race. For the first time, I've attended the planning sessions for the event and I've seen the amount of work involved in putting together a first-class event. This year Anne Littrell took over planning the driving school and is doing a tremendous job getting everything organized. Our goal for the HPDE is to make it fun for the participants and volunteers while putting on a safe event. I'll give you a brief overview on the HPDE setup steps from the last few months.

The first milestone is picking a date, which requires coordination with the track and the local hotels. There are a surprising number of activities in the Indio area that have to be scheduled around. Once a date has been selected, the track and hotel contracts have to be negotiated and deposits have to be sent. Now the business of organizing the event begins. The format of the event needs to be chosen and detailed schedules need to be setup. This year we are running the driving school and a club race so the schedule has to be planned with extreme care.

Now that the format is set, we can start signing up students and racers. While signups trickle in, the team continues the detailed planning, including food, flag crew, ambulance, tow truck, volunteer and instructor assignments, and truck and trailer transport. Now that the logistics are in place, the final step is developing the student assignments matching the various drivers and cars with the available instructors. With the planning completed, the weekend of the event will have 60 students, 20 club racers, 30 instructors, 10 flag workers, 7 volunteers, track workers and a schedule with very little room for error. Needless to say, I'm really glad that Anne is in charge, and I'm looking forward to congratulating her on a fantastic event.

Getting this all accomplished requires a lot of volunteers who I want to thank for their contribution. Anne for taking over the event planning and logistics. Dan Tackett for recruiting instructors and setting up the run groups, with Seth Hanson's assistance. Kelly Moon, once again Chief Steward, will be running the track with Nate Risch helping out. Matthew Kogan coordinated the club racers group and will keep them in hand during the weekend. Rich Gehring is preparing the equipment trailer and giving ride-alongs during the event. Don Duncan is keeping the budget under control and driving the trailer to Chuckwalla. Andre and Ines Pantic will be helping out at the event along with Lindsey Draime.

Our board meetings are the second Tuesday of the month at Giovanni's, 9353 Clairemont Mesa Blvd. We welcome visitors so come by and see what we are planning. The formal meeting starts at 6:30pm, but get there at 5:45pm for pizza, soda, and conversation with fellow BMW fans. All members and prospective members are welcome. We hope to see you there!





Come on out to Qualcomm's big west lot on Saturday, May 9th and celebrate spring with us! With an extra hour of sunlight, we're back to 100 open spots – that should put a spring in your step!

Please note: We have new car classifications as shown at right. Please update Motorsport Reg with your new car class and if you have questions, feel free to email us at autocross-director@sdbmwcca.com.

Remember the sound limit at Qualcomm: all cars must be under a 92db noise level – we'll be checking!

Our sincerest thanks to BMW of El Cajon for their continued support of our Autocross Program!

Newcomers: We've all had a first time and we're all still learning, so relax, have fun and enjoy your time with us. You will have an instructor take you around the course for one lap in your car showing you turn-in points, braking zones and so on. Your instructor will then ride with you for your next three laps helping you learn the course. In your next session, and the timed runs, you can have an instructor with you as much or as little as you want – whatever makes you comfortable. These events are what you make them;

you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

See the **Autocross Information Page** at http://www.sdbmwcca.com/autocross to get a better idea of how to prepare for this wonderfully addictive sport for your first time.

Note: We do run if it's raining – you'll learn more and your tires will wear less – so if you see some unusual drops of water falling from the sky, grab your raingear and head to the Q! Also, the helmet standard has changed to require Snell 2005 or 2010 ratings. Check yours now to be sure it's up to date – rentals are limited.

The entry fee is \$65, including breakfast items, lunch and beverages. You can pay online if you register in advance at http://sdbmwcca.motorsportreg.com, or with cash or check if you wait to register onsite. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate, and you can join online at www.bmwcca. org in advance. Please **print and bring your membership confirmation** if you have not yet received your BMW CCA membership card. We check membership of all participants at the gate.

REMEMBER: IF REGISTERED ONLINE, **BRING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP** AND ARRIVE BY 7:30 (BEFORE ON-SITE CUT-OFF) TO KEEP YOUR RESERVED SPOT

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a **mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am** and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

When you arrive:

- 1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.
- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. You are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a novice or class trophy you are no longer a novice.

Independent Motorcars Tech Session

Before every High Performance Driving Event (HPDE), the participants must have a tech inspection completed by a qualified BMW mechanic. A few months before our Chuckwalla HPDE, Chris Keefer, owner of Independent Motorcars, offered to host a tech session to show our members what the tech inspection covered. Chris offered to provide food and to do a free inspection and brake fluid flush for

all attendees. This was an offer that we couldn't refuse, so we scheduled a February 18th date at Chris' shop. A week before the event Chris was concerned that there weren't very many RSVPs, but we assured him that the club would turn out for free food and the chance to look at cars up on a lift.

On the 18th I made my way to Independent Motorcars, conveniently located in the Miramar Autoport Mall. I thought I was early but there were already 20 people in the shop. There were two cars lined up for inspection, an E30 318 convertible and Shawn Flanagan's Valencia Orange

IM Coupe. Chris had promised that he would have a car that wouldn't pass – my money was on the E30. After filling up on delicious catered Mexican food, we started the session. Although this inspection would be in the shop, Chris emphasized the importance of the road test to be able to determine if there were any problems with the car being inspected. This resulted in some good-natured kidding about good places to

test the IM, while keeping strictly to the speed limits. After that our attention turned to the 318. Chris began by pushing down the nose and counting how many times it bounced, apparently 3 bounces is bad. OK, so the shocks were shot. Next up a check under the hood - the hoses and belts were surprisingly good and there were no obvious leaks. Now the 318 went up on the lift so that we could get a good look at the suspension. Chris showed us how to check the play in the bearings and pointed out that I" of play is bad. While the car was in the air, he showed us where to check the tire date code and suggested that a different tire make on each wheel was not recommended. There were a few more problems, clearly this car would need a lot of work before it would be ready to drive.

Now we were ready to inspect the IM. Since it is a low mileage car I expected that the inspection would go very quickly. Chris pointed out that inspecting a newer car was just as important as an old one, especially if the car was a veteran of previous HPDE events. He showed how to check for cracks on the drilled brake rotors as well as checking the pads. As with all modern BMWs, getting a clear view of the underside requires removing the underbody panels. Chris's tech made quick work of the panels and we got to see the beautiful aluminum components that are usually hidden from view. There was a little bit of oil on the pan from the gasket but it wasn't a concern because HPDE use won't make that type of drip worse. Chris mentioned that if you see oil on the garage floor from a late model car you should have it checked. Because of the underbody panels, there can be a lot of oil trapped before you see it on the garage floor.

I want to thank Chris for inviting the club to his shop and for providing dinner for 35 members. Also, I want to thank Autobahn Parts for providing the 318 that "failed" inspection. I noticed a few members looking it over closely, maybe we will see an article about saving a 318 'vert from being parted out in a future Fahren Affairs.

Built Not Bought! by Andrew Golseth

When gearheads can't buy what they want, they build it. That's exactly what automotive enthusiast Amir Abadi did. Amir is a student at San Francisco State University and, like many of you, he dreams of owning his very own E30 M3. Unfortunately, Amir currently suffers from an all too common illness known as "full-time student" syndrome, which has temporarily delayed his dream of buying the homologation collector racing legend. That was until he realized he could just build one. As an engineering student Amir had a vision of building a LEGO version of his dream car.

Last year, Amir downloaded the LEGO Digital Designer (LDD) program and started building an E30 M3. It took over three months of virtual designing and over four months to source all of the bricks needed to complete the build! The fit and finish is spot on and the details are spectacular. With the body's infamous box flares surrounding the multi-piece mesh wheels, chrome kidney grills, and high-rise DTMstyle rear wing these bricks are unquestionably an E30 M3. However, the details under the classic greenhouse are equally impressive with period correct tan interior, manual shift knob, roundel centered steering wheel, and dashboard. The amount of effort Amir put into this build is beyond reproach.

Amir initially built this LEGO M3 out of his own personal interest. Fortunately for the rest of us, this build has a chance at becoming an official LEGO set that could be found on our local toy store shelves. During the build, Amir discovered LEGO Ideas, a LEGO program designed to give fans a chance at seeing their work become an official licensed LEGO product.
