Autocross emphasizes driver skill and vehicle handling rather than just speed. The corners are tight, so the driving is exciting and challenging, but you won't reach higher speeds like you do on a track. A day of autocrossing is far safer for both car and driver than most people's daily commute to work.

Autocross is usually a competitive sport, but our Heart of Dixie autocross is for fun and education. The skills you will learn and practice here like smooth transitions, enhanced braking, and skid correction are skills you will use out on the road. Before starting our autocross, we'll walk the course. This will help drivers to follow the layout and avoid getting lost among the cones. When your group is up, you can run the course as many times as you can fit into the group run time. At the end of the day, we'll do one timed run—that's the extent of our competition.

The course may seem "busy" at first, because it's tighter than what you see on the street, and you're trying to attack it faster than you could in traffic. You'll have fun learning to keep the car in control as you get faster and better with more seat-time.

Autocross is also a social sport. The camaraderie of the drivers is a part of autocrossing that is very satisfying. The goal is to have fun—that's why everyone is here. Bring your car and a helmet if you own one (motorcycle helmets are fine). If you don't own a helmet, we have some loaners. You might want to also bring sunscreen, a folding chair, a blanket, snacks, drinks, and rain gear.

We've had a great showing the last couple of times with over 80 folks signed up. The vast majority of them had never done anything like this before and HAD A BLAST! We hope to see you there!

the most interesting tracks in the country, with 15 challenging turns within 2.3 miles.

The Driver's Event is the Club's most exciting and popular yearly event, so if you're a new member and have an interest in finding out what your BMW can do, then this may be the event for you. The Heart of Dixie chapter has been putting on a DE since Barber Motorsports Park opened in 2003 and at \$430.00, it's one of the more affordable DEs.

If you're new to the HOD DE, then the weekend goes like this: show up at the track Friday evening for registration, pick up your student or instructor packet including car numbers and schedule. You will be required to turn in all of the registration forms and have your helmet checked. Saturday morning the day starts at 7:30 in the Media Room, where driving instructors will be assigned and students given

an overview of the Barber track. Driving groups are broken up into novice, intermediate, and advanced/solo. If you're new to performance driving or to the Heart of Dixie school, you will be put into the novice group at least in the beginning. Your track schedule will tell you what time to show up at the entrance to the track where you'll meet up with your instructor. There are usually 4 scheduled 25 minute runs per group per day and several classroom sessions. 25 minutes on the track at a time doesn't sound like a lot, but you will find that it's more than enough time.

Preparing for the DE Getting your brakes ready for the track

If the DE sounds interesting to you and you've never participated in a DE the one thing you need to do is check over your brakes. Track time is a blast but with it comes new demands on your car that easily exceed any normal stresses associated with everyday grocery-getting. Not to worry—the Bimmer is built to take it—but you have to do your part as an owner too.

FIRST AND FOREMOST, make sure your brake pads have plenty of thickness so you don't end up with metal-to-metal contact between pads and rotors. If you really think you're going to push as hard as you can, might want to get track pads for your DE experience as they will last a lot longer and will not tend to fade nearly as fast as street pads.

SECOND, AND VERY IMPORTANT! Have your brake fluid flushed (or do it yourself) so it has the maximum boiling point possible. For some reason brake fluid is hydroscopic (absorbs water) and that is bad news when your brakes start getting hot from repeated hard braking on the track. The water will boil and starts filling your brakes with steam and that will not stop your car. Be sure to use the same DOT



rating as your current fluid, mixing results is a real mess that will require rebuilding the entire brake system.

These few steps will make your track day fun—BIG TIME!

Of course there are a lot of other things you can do but just get through this first DE and we'll talk about the additional equipment and modifications in future newsletters.

Good luck on your track event, it's worth every penny of it.
